

Gabriel Haley is an Associate Professor of English at Concordia University-Nebraska, where he has served since 2013. Previously he taught at Concordia College-New York, the University of Virginia, and the Evanjelické Lýceum in Bratislava, Slovakia. He specializes in medieval to renaissance literature, and his teaching includes World Literatures, Poetry, Mythmaking and the Inklings, and Latin. He has published on topics such as vernacular theology and the poetry of Charles d'Orléans, Petrarch's humanism, the role of Dante in popular culture, and C. S. Lewis's educational philosophy. He advises Concordia's English honor society, Sigma Tau, and he serves on the board of directors for the Consortium for Classical Lutheran Education. Haley has a B.A. in English and Classics from Hillsdale College, and an M.A. and Ph.D. in English from the University of Virginia. He lives in Seward with his wife, Jane, and their four children.
